Welcome to **Aline**

Idyllic West Coast river and loch fishing

You will feel as though you have discovered a secret when you fish the Aline catchment, a hidden west coast gem. The Aline offers superb river and loch fishing set against the heather-clad hills and wooded straths of the Morvern peninsula.



The water of the River Aline is crystal clear and provides 3 miles of double bank fishing on a traditional Highland spate river. Salmon and sea trout run the river from late spring onwards, with the best fishing in August and September as the grilse come in. There's also loch fishing for wild brown trout on Lochs Arienas, Doire nam Mart and Tearnait as well as 16 hill lochs within the Estate. With so much variety, this is one location you'll be tempted to return to again and again.



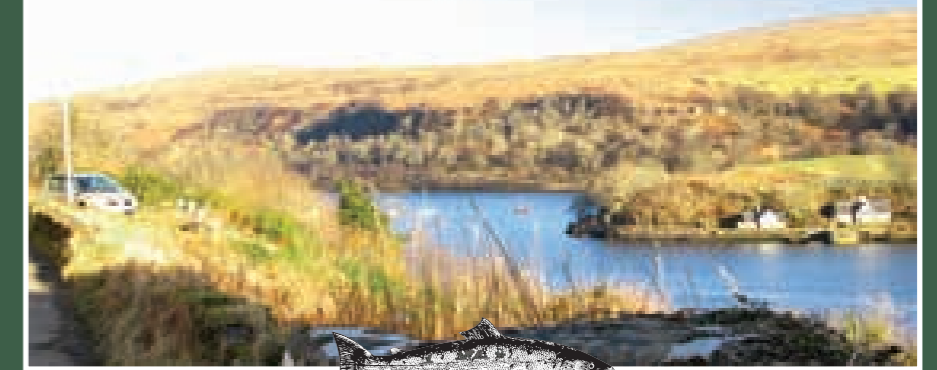
What will you catch?

Season

- The trout season runs from March until 15 October •

- 100% catch and release •
- Fly fishing only •
- All anglers must provide a catch return to the estate •
- Permits are available from the Ardtornish Estate •



Everything you need to know

Excellent value for money

The River Aline has both Salmon and Sea Trout and is divided into beats for 2 rods each. These rotate and rods fish 3 beats per day.

- Fishing for two rods is £30 per day from July to October and £10 per day for two rods in May and June •
- You can fish Arienas and Doire nam Mart for £8.50 per day and other hill lochs for £5 per day •
- Boat hire is available at £30 per day on Loch Arienas (£45 with an engine) and £20 per day on Loch Tearnait •

Getting there

Aline is located north west of Oban on the west coast of Scotland and is part of the Ardtornish Estate which offers a range of accommodation and other outdoor pursuits including stalking and shooting.

Finding your way from the mainland

- Cross Loch Linnhe via the Corran Ferry.
- Then continue on the A861 out of Ardgour.
- Just before the head of Loch Sunart turn left onto the A884 signposted to Lochaline.
- Follow this scenic road for approximately 10 miles until just before Lochaline village.
- Turn left onto the road signposted for Ardtornish and follow this over the river and round to the left to the estate office where information and permits are available.



Finding your way from Mull

- Take the Fishnish ferry to Lochaline.
- Go out through the village and a mile north take a right turn signposted Ardtornish.
- Follow the estate road over the river and round to the left to the estate office where information and permits are available.

Your Guide To Aline

There is no through road here, the road ends at Loch Teacuis and you must double back to the main road. _____

5. Loch Arenas: _____
Drifting just off the shore is the best place for fishing in the Loch. The Northern shore tends to shelve off steeply and is less productive for fishing. The eastern end of the loch (near the outflow) provides excellent fishing.

4. Acharn Pool: _____
At the point where Loch Arenas flows into the river there is a pool with a sand bank on the southern side. All of this area is good for fishing, especially the sand bank and the bank to the West.

Lochaline Village:
3km from the mouth of the river, Lochaline has a shop, post office, cafe, dive centre, restaurant and hotel. Ferries run from the village over to Mull (Fishnish) several times a day. Boats can be chartered in the village for sea fishing. _____

1. Long Pool: _____
From the parking space make your way down to the river and fish the pool from the rock wall on the far bank to the dead trees (also on the far bank).

2. Ardtornish Estate Office: _____
The information centre at the estate office is the place to buy permits and get fishing tips. The estate also offers other activities such as stalking and walking, for further information visit their Information Centre (9am to 3pm Mon-Fri).

3. Castle Pool: _____
The first resting pool after the sea pool. Fish tend to lie in the fast water at the head and tail of the pool.
