# Enjoy the dramatic surroundings and wild fishing in Lochaber.

Strontian is the perfect starting point for exploring the Ardnamurchan Peninsula a wild, remote and beautiful area of Scotland, dominated by Ben Resipole, the distinctive peak that offers incredible views of the peninsula.



Strontian village manages to combine a relaxed atmosphere and remote feel with a modern set of facilities. Surrounded by moorland, forests, lochs and beaches there is plenty to explore including the magnificent Sanna Bay and wildlife is abundant, from golden eagles to whales and dolphins. You never know what you might spot!







# - What will you catch? –

#### Season

- On the River Shiel and River Polloch, the fishing season runs from 1 May to 30 September •
- On Loch Doilet the fishing season runs from 15 March to 30 September •

## Remember

#### Rivers Shiel and Polloch and Loch Doilet

- · Catch and release for all salmon and sea trout ·
- Fishing with bait or barbed hooks is not permitted
- Catch and release for all salmon and sea trout.



# Everything you need to know -

## **Excellent value for money**

Permits to fish Rivers Shiel & Polloch cost:

- £20 per rod per day
- £50 per rod per week

Loch Doilet requires a boat and boat hire and permits costs are:

- £30 for one rod per boat per day
- £75 for one rod per boat per week
- £40 for two rods per boat per day
- £125 for two rods per boat per week
- An electric outboard can be hired for £10 per day or £50 per week.

Permits are available from the Strontian village shop, Strontian post office or Mrs M Gasgoigne, 2 Polloch Cottages, Polloch.

# **Getting there**

Strontian is situated on the A861, at the head of glorious Loch Sunart and less than 20 miles from Fort William. Fishing in this area offers the choice of fishing in either the River Strontian, the River Polloch or Loch Doilet. Surrounded by stunning natural beauty, this is an area that is unforgettable for all the right reasons.

# Finding your way -

## To Strontian Village

Cross Linnhe via the Corran Ferry.

Continue on the A861 out of Ardgour and through Glen Tarbert until you come to the village of Strontian.

The post office is on your left just before you enter the village and the tourist information centre, shop and cafe are on the village green on your right before you cross the river.



#### Finding your way to the river and loch

To get to the River Polloch and Loch Doilet turn right immediately after the bridge over the Strontian River.

Keep on this road bearing left past the turning to Ariundle.

The road is steep with dramatic views as you cross the watershed and head down into Glen Hurich.

At the bottom of the hill follow the road to the left, which will take you along Loch Doilet and to the head of the Polloch River.
